Without CON, broad access to quality care and good health outcomes will suffer.

If Certificate of Need was eliminated, insurance plans and out-of-state, for-profit healthcare companies could come into our communities, set up shop and cherry-pick only the most profitable services with the highest reimbursement rates and could refuse care to all who need it.

When Certificate of Need is eliminated, patients and communities feel the negative consequences.

Just look at what's happened in the states where lawmakers have made this misguided decision.

Florida dropped its CON requirement in 2019 and, <u>as reported by USA Today</u>, now has too many healthcare facilities popping up in the same areas, particularly in affluent communities, while people in more rural areas must travel hundreds of miles for care. **This disparity impacts healthcare staffing and leads to higher healthcare costs.**

Maintaining CON will protect access to quality care for all Kentuckians!
